What is a language revitalization plan and why develop one?

A language revitalization plan guides the work of language revitalization in a community over several years. It provides a strategic road map for how a community will achieve a united vision for its language.

There are many benefits to developing a language revitalization plan, such as:

- Identifying what's already happening to support language revitalization in the community and what still needs to be done.
- Ensuring language projects build on each other to achieve language revitalization.
- Validating the importance of the community's language and revitalization.
- Bringing community members together to identify a shared vision and goals.
- Generating support from leadership.
- Demonstrating capacity and attracting resources and funding.
- Monitoring progress towards language revitalization goals

How is a language revitalization plan different from a language project?

A language project is a single activity, such as forming a language nest or developing a curriculum. Activities have a start date, an end date and a near-term goal.

A language plan includes a broad range of projects that are needed to revitalize a language and maps out multiple years of language work. It is designed to achieve a long-term vision.
