Revitalization Planning Coaches

FPCC's Revitalization Planning Coaches are available to offer support for First Nation communities and organizations in B.C. The Coaches provide leadership through subject matter expertise, ongoing project support and sharing of good practices. In addition, they facilitate peer-to-peer knowledge exchanges and networking for communities.

The Coaches are available to listen and engage with community representatives to consider each community's unique circumstances and challenges. They offer skills-based training and professional development that is tailored to each community's strengths and needs.

What do the Coaches support?

The Coaches specialize in strategic and project planning for language, arts and heritage revitalization. Below are some examples of frequently asked questions:

- How do I start a language, arts or heritage revitalization initiative?
- What is a Language Status Assessment and why do I need to do one?
- What are the most effective strategies for language, arts or heritage revitalization?
- How can I get through this unexpected circumstance that is impacting my community revitalization program?
- How can I get my community interested and mobilized for language, arts or revitalization?
- How do I create a long-term vision for our community's cultural revitalization?
- What kind of details should I include when developing our work/project plan?
- What are the roles and responsibilities of a language planner, or other roles within revitalization?
